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# Temecula, California

## Wine Country Adventure and Serenity

**H**alfway between the bustling city of Los Angeles and the idyllic seaside escape of San Diego lies Temecula. In a world of its own, this laid-back wine country city is a throwback to a time when the Old West was won and cowboys walked the streets, yet its genteel side shows through wineries and tasting rooms that showcase award-winning vintages. It enjoys warm, dry summers and cool winters thanks to its location in the French Valley, just 22 miles inland from the Pacific Ocean. Days often begin with a cool morning mist, which then gives way to sunny middays and gentle afternoon ocean breezes. This year-round temperate climate is perfect for a game of golf, a round of wine tasting, a relaxed hot-air balloon flight, a glimpse back into the Wild West with a live action show, or a day of shopping. Temecula offers a picturesque and inviting escape, with a casual spin that can only be found in Southern California's wine country.

### Flying There

French Valley Airport (F70) lies southeast of Los Angeles in the eastern portion of the southern California coastal basin. Due to the complicated local airspace with four Class C areas, two Class B areas, MOAs, restricted areas, and mountains, refer to the Los Angeles Terminal Area Chart (TAC) for flights here. Mountains ring the basin to the north and east, the tallest of which rises to 11,500 feet MSL. Arrivals from the northwest should contact SoCal Approach at least 30 nm out from LAX for flight following through the busy areas; frequencies are depicted on the Los Angeles TAC. The best route takes you southeast below the area where the Los Angeles Class B and Ontario Class C airspaces overlap. From the northeast, you can fly through the Banning Pass; contact SoCal Approach on 119.65 MHz. From the east, you can cross near Julian VOR (JLI 114.0 MHz), but be cautious of possible severe turbulence in this area when winds are strong. Study the VFR Sectional to familiarize yourself with the numerous MOAs southeast of Palm Springs.

The non-towered airport at French Valley has a GPS instrument approach for its 6,000 x 75-foot Runway 18. Watch for helicopters, military traffic, hang gliders, ultra lights, sailplanes, skydivers, and hot air balloons. SoCal Approach can provide information regarding active jump zones. For noise abatement, fly a wide traffic pattern east of the runway between two small ranches that are noise-sensitive. Similarly, on departure, climb at Vy to traffic pattern altitude and avoid making right turns from Runway 18.

Self-serve fuel is available midfield and at the south end of the runway. **The Jet Center**, on the northwest side of the field, offers fuel and complimentary tiedowns, and will arrange a Hertz, Enterprise, or Avis rental car with prior notice, open 8 a.m.–5 p.m., 951-696-9344, [www.frenchvalleyfbo.com](http://www.frenchvalleyfbo.com). **French Valley Aviation**, on the west side of the runway near midfield, supplies fuel, tiedowns for \$5–\$7, and will have an Avis or Enterprise car waiting with prior notice, open Mon–Fri 6 a.m.–5 p.m., Sat–Sun 8 a.m.–5 p.m., 951-677-2756, [www.rcfva.com](http://www.rcfva.com). The main terminal area houses the French Valley Café (see *Where to Eat*) and the Wings & Rotors Air Museum is near the north end of the field (see *What to Do*).

## History

Spanish missionaries settled in the Temecula Valley in 1797. However, long before Padre Juan Norberto de Santiago first set foot here, natives known as the Temeekeyam Indians, now generally referred to as the Luiseños, inhabited the area. The Pechanga Band of Luiseños believes their ancestors inhabited this area for more than 10,000 years. According to Pechanga history, they called the area “Temeekung,” which was later translated by the Spanish into Temecula and means “the place of the sun” or “where the sun breaks through the mist” in the native language. The Mission of San Luis Rey de Francia was built in 1798, and the Mission San Antonio de Pala in 1816. In 1857, seven years after California became a state, a stagecoach line was established from St. Louis, through Temecula, to San Francisco. The traffic spurred the establishment of California’s second post office. The Pechanga Indian Reservation, formed in 1882, has grown to more than 5,500 acres and now also serves as the site for Pechanga Casino and Resort.

During the late 1800s, Temecula became a center for agriculture and cattle. It was a

time of cowboys, cattle drives, stagecoaches, hold-ups, and all things synonymous with the Old West. Over the years, cattle and agriculture gave way to industry, real estate, and winemaking.

The Temecula wine industry dates to the first mission padres. The modern wineries began here in the mid-20th century and the Temecula American Viticultural Area (AVA) was established in 1984. Temecula’s warm climate is well suited to Mediterranean varietals like Viognier, Syrah, and Pinot Gris, as well as Rhone varietals like Zinfandel and Cabernet Sauvignon. Today, you’ll find more than 35 wineries here, blessed by beneficial weather year-round.

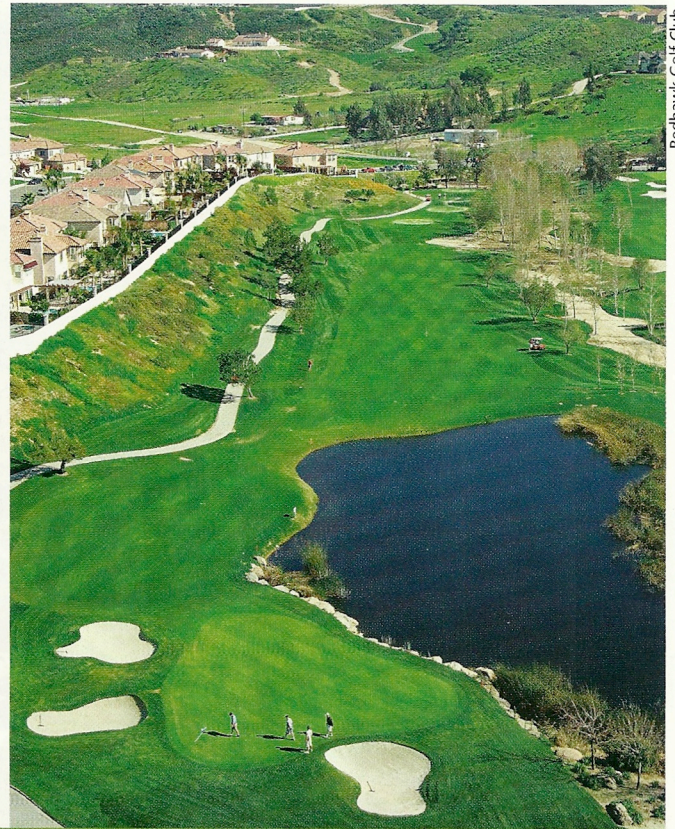
## What to Do

Start your local tour at the airport’s **Wings and Rotors Museum**. Its airworthy Bell UH-1B Huey is still configured as it flew in Vietnam. The Bell OH-58A flew in Desert Storm, and two other helicopters are undergoing restoration. The current big project is an F-4 Phantom in Navy markings, one of the few privately owned, flyable Phantoms in the world. The museum is non-profit, suggested donation \$5, open Mon–Fri (occasionally on Saturdays) 9 a.m.–

The Temecula Valley is also rich in history, from ancient Indian occupants to stagecoaches and cowboys. **Old Town Temecula** on Front Street, designated a Historical Preservation District, provides a glimpse of the valley's heritage. The preserved historical architecture and rustic wooden boardwalks evoke a time when horses were hitched up outside the local watering hole. A trip to the Old West wouldn't be complete without a little rope trickery or a few gunfights. **Western Days** features the Temecula Gunfighters, numerous visiting gun-fighting clubs, costumed characters, trick ropers, Western exhibits and music, a chili cook-off, and calf roping. Exhibits and attractions are located at booths, restaurants, and shops along Front Street. Don't miss the high noon shoot out and robbery at The Bank Mexican Restaurant & Bar. The Bank, originally built in 1914 and robbed only once by bandits, was the First National Bank of Temecula until it closed in 1941, free, May 18-19, 11 a.m.-5 p.m., 951-694-6480, [www.cityoftemecula.org](http://www.cityoftemecula.org).

The 361-seat **Old Town Temecula Community Theater** is housed in the historic 1890 Mercantile Building and offers dance, classical, groove, and big band performances. An art gallery showcases local and national artists; gallery and ticket hours Wed 2-6 p.m., Thu-Fri 2-9 p.m., Sat

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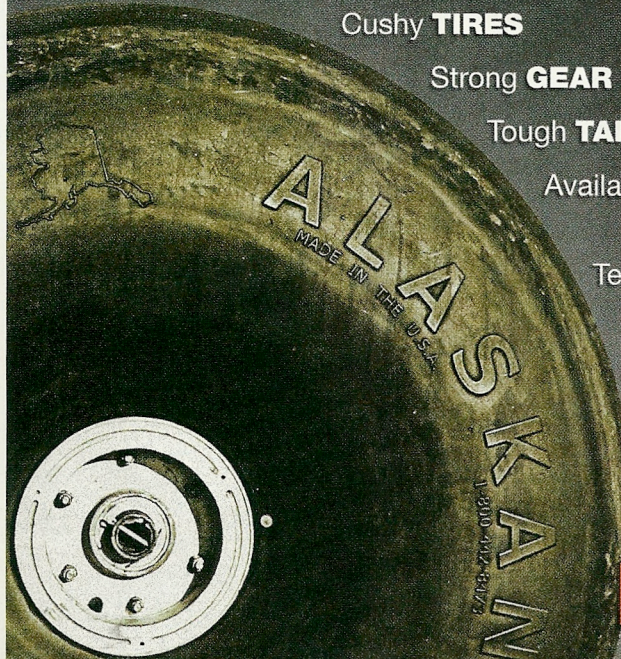
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12-9 p.m., Sun 12-5 p.m., 42051 Main St., 866-653-8696, [www.temeculatbeater.org](http://www.temeculatbeater.org).

More than 35 wineries are found among the area's 35,000 acres of rolling hills and vineyards. Vacationers can plan a day around the valley based solely on wine tasting. Most wineries offer tastings of three to six wines and are open 10 a.m.-5 p.m., 951-699-3626, [www.temeculawines.org](http://www.temeculawines.org).

A large rustic wooden barn serves as the tasting room at **Longshadow Ranch Vineyard and Winery**. Take a walk around the picturesque grounds, sip wine on the shaded back patio, or make new friends, including the four-legged kind. Belgian draft horses pull old-fashioned carriages for romantic carriage vineyard

tours, complimentary with purchase (weather permitting), while friendly goats greet you in the petting zoo. Longshadow features standard varietals along with new favorites like their sweet white merlot and cinsault, a rare red wine not often grown in the U.S. Make sure you try the Belgium Chocolate Ponderosa Port Boot Shooter, their unique Solera-style Ponderosa Port, aged in whiskey barrels and served in a cute Belgium chocolate shooter cup, shaped like a cowboy boot, \$5. Tastings run \$15 including five wines, Mon-Thu 11 a.m.-5 p.m., Sat-Sun. 10 a.m.-5 p.m., live music some Sat nights until 10 p.m., 39847 Calle Contento, 951-587-6221, [www.longshadowranchwinery.com](http://www.longshadowranchwinery.com).

A different experience awaits at **Monte De Oro Winery**, one of the valley's newest. Its location atop a hill offers panoramic views of the Temecula wine valley. Enjoy your wine in the tasting room and look out the enormous arched casement window, or bring it out to the patio overlooking the vines and watch a wine country sunset. In the center of the tasting room is a large glass floor that overlooks the barrel room; ladies, you may not want to wear a dress here! A barrel room private tour takes you down through a darkened stone stairway to the underground barrel room where hundreds of casks are stacked, waiting to age to perfection. Look above through the glass ceiling and watch other tasters walk across, \$18 per person. Tastings cost \$12 and include six wines, 10 a.m.-5 p.m., 35820 Rancho California Rd., 951-491-6551, [www.montedeoro.com](http://www.montedeoro.com).

Wine Country Trails by Horseback offers one-hour **guided horseback wine country tours** through the rolling hills. Owner Diana LeFort has been working with horses for over 30 years and loves introducing guests to riding. Learn the history of the valley, special nuances of wine country, or tailor your tour package to include wine tasting, lunch, or dinner. Choose from early morning, afternoon, or sunset rides that begin at Wilson Creek Winery, age seven and up, starting at \$80 per person, 951-506-8706, [www.winecountrytrailsbyhorseback.com](http://www.winecountrytrailsbyhorseback.com).

This year marks the 30th anniversary of the **Balloon and Wine Tasting Festival**, which is held at the Lake Skinner recreation area, less than five miles east of French Valley Airport, May 31-June 2. Hot air balloon rides, wines from more than 25 wineries, fine arts, a food court, kid's fair, more than 200 vendors, and concerts throughout the day draw guests from around the area. Check the website for food/wine or food/wine/beer pairings, \$65-\$75. Admission runs \$17-\$24, 60-min sunrise balloon rides \$200 including festival admission, 951-676-6713, [www.tvbuf.com](http://www.tvbuf.com).

If you can't wait until summer to experience the thrill of soaring to new heights in a hot air balloon, book a **hot air balloon ride** with D&D Ballooning. Sunrise flights provide views of citrus groves, peaceful vineyards, and local wildlife. After an hour flight, land in a vineyard for a picnic of champagne and brunch, which ends around 9:30 a.m., \$150. D&D's 32 years of flight experience give them the skills to offer unique adventures, such as their night-into-morning flight that begins at 5 a.m., so you experience the glowing hot air balloon against a dark sky, yet land at sunrise. Other flights include "mile-high" club (yes, really), parachute jumping, and tethered flights. Private and group flights are also offered, \$120-\$1,200, departures from Wilson Creek Vineyard, 35960 Rancho California Rd., 951-303-0448 or 800-510-9000, [www.hotairadventures.com](http://www.hotairadventures.com).

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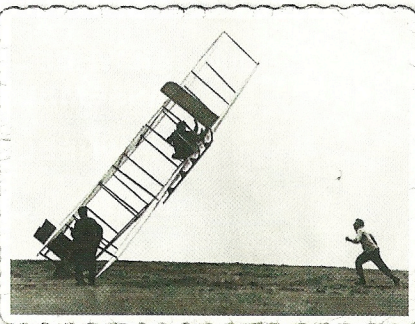

Try your luck at the **Pechanga Resort and Casino** on the outskirts of Old Town Temecula. The casino is California's largest, with more than 200,000 square feet of gaming, 3,000 slot and video machines, and more than 130 gaming tables. Headliners like Kelly Clarkson, Liza Minelli, Wynona, and the Goo-Goo Dolls perform at the resort's outdoor amphitheater. Live shows have included performances by David Copperfield, Jerry Seinfeld, and George Lopez. The casino also features numerous dining options, a cabaret lounge, two nightclubs, a comedy club, and 517 luxury

hotel rooms, \$139-\$340, 45000 Pechanga Pkwy, 951-693-1819 or 888-PECHANGA, [www.pechanga.com](http://www.pechanga.com).

One of the few island greens in Southern California is the par-3 eighth hole at the **Redhawk Golf Club**, considered among the best public courses in Southern California's Inland Empire. Rolling contours on the 18-hole, 7,056-yard course offer a challenge for golfers of every level. ### Where to Stay

Some lodging options are right in the heart of wine country at one of the plush vineyard resorts, while others include comfortable accommodations in the center of town.

The newest hotel, the California mission style-inspired **Ponte Vineyard Inn** opened in May 2012. All the comforts of a AAA four-diamond hotel are combined with unique features, such as 300 acres of lush vineyards, the surrounding mountain ranges, and a serene private pond with a rustic windmill. Bask in the sun

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on the inn's Italian courtyard while sipping a syrah. The 60 rooms feature Keurig coffee and tea stations, complimentary WiFi, and iPod docking stations, and boast accents like French double doors that open to a view of the vineyard or the pond from a private patio or balcony. For the best view of the sprawling grounds and the quaint pond, book the deluxe double queen room. A wine tasting room is next door. Ponte is the only vineyard to feature a full bar in addition to its winery. The two dining options on the property are the Cellar Lounge and Bouquet gourmet restaurant. **Southcoast Winery Resort & Spa** sits on 400 acres of beautiful vineyard property with views of nearby Mount Palomar. The winery produces award-winning wines, and the full-service resort offers a swimming pool, a Tuscan-inspired restaurant, and a private spa that offers deep tissue and warm stone treatments. Accommodations at the opulent resort include 76 luxury private villa-style cottages with Spanish tile roofs, each measuring 490 to 1,150 square feet. The villas feature large marble spa tubs and dual showers, a fireplace, and private vineyard-view terraces, all with no shared common walls for complete privacy, \$185-\$259, 34843 Rancho California Rd., 951-587-9463 or 866-9-WINERY, [www.wineresort.com](http://www.wineresort.com).

The **Hampton Inn & Suites** is conveniently located within walking distance to the attractions, restaurants, and bars in Old Town Temecula. Rooms feature flat-screen TVs, plush bedding, and a complimentary full hot breakfast buffet. Upgrade to a king-bed studio suite with in-room whirlpool tub for a little extra luxury and relaxation, \$109-\$209, 28190 Jefferson Ave., 951-506-2331, [www.bilton.com](http://www.bilton.com).

### Where to Eat

The quickest and closest bite to the airport is at **French Valley Cafe**. Their Club Sandwich is piled skyscraper-high with turkey, ham, bacon, lettuce, and tomato, entrées \$9-\$14, open Mon-Thu 8 a.m.-9 p.m., Fri-Sat 8 a.m.-10 p.m., Sun 8 a.m.-4 p.m., 37600 Sky Canyon Rd., 951-600-7396, [www.frenchvalleycafe.org](http://www.frenchvalleycafe.org).

Relaxed al fresco dining under the terrace offers expansive views of the Temecula Valley at **The Restaurant at Leoness Cellars**, which was recently voted "Best Restaurant" by the readers of Inland Empire magazine. Chef Daragh Matheson employs nearly 30 years of experience to craft culinary creations that delight the senses. Even his crispy French fries are made by hand from scratch, cooked in a secret blend of oils, and then paired with flavors like melted gorgonzola or a salty, crisped bacon parmesan and garlic. Everything on Daragh's menu is made from scratch, and according to him, "comes from the heart."

His specialty, pan-seared Alaskan Halibut in a port butter reduction over truffle risotto, literally melts in your mouth with each tender bite, entrées \$7-\$18, open 11 a.m.-5 p.m., 38311 De Portola Rd., 951-302-7601, [www.leonesscellars.com](http://www.leonesscellars.com).


Old Town Temecula's **Public House** offers gastropub dining in a historic home that has been converted to a restaurant. Opt for the "backyard" dining experience, and you'll be seated outside in a relaxed, yet upbeat environment surrounded by fire pits and unique water features. Call ahead, because it gets packed on weekends. Try the Kobe Euro Tour, a 10-ounce burger of ground Kobe Beef that comes with a warning: "never cooked over medium, even for five bucks." It is topped with melted bleu cheese and sun-dried tomato basil aioli on a toasted Brioche bun; pair it with the Black Market Hefeweizen for a refreshing lunch, entrées \$14-\$36, open Sun-Thu 11 a.m.-10 p.m., Fri-Sat 11 a.m.-1 a.m., 41971 Main St., 951-676-7305, [www.publichouse.tv](http://www.publichouse.tv).

Don't let the name fool you, the Gambling Cowboy Chophouse and Saloon is anything but a rowdy, rustic spot full of drunken cowboys. The restaurant is located off Front Street in Old Town Temecula on the third level of an old wooden saloon building, but step inside, and you are greeted with Victorian era class and relaxed ambience with dimmed lighting, as a pianist softens the mood with con-

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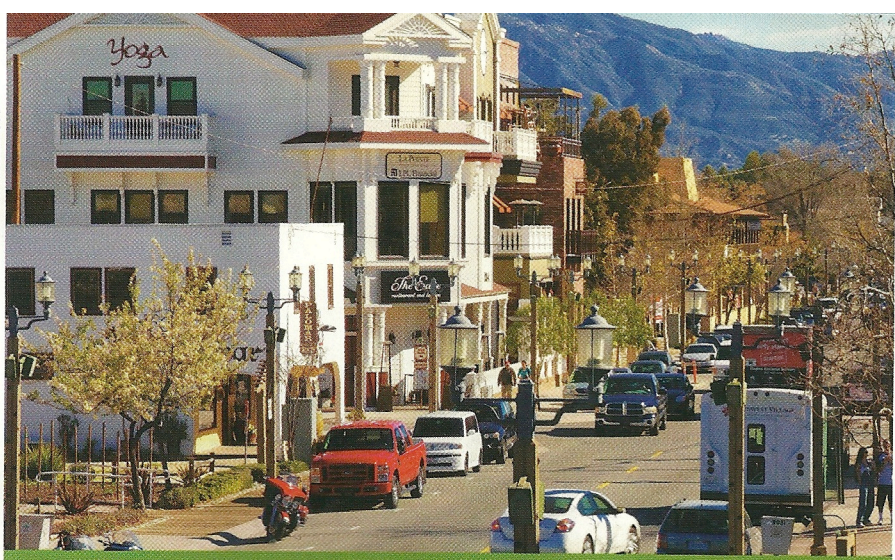

temporary music. Try the Gambler, a smoky, robust "cowboy cut" certified Angus beef rib eye, charbroiled to perfection, topped with maïtre d' butter, and offered with a side of crisp green beans and a loaded baked potato. Pair it with a local vineyard cabernet to complement the smoky flavor of the meat, entrées \$20-\$48, breakfast Sat-Sun 9 a.m.-2 p.m., lunch Tue-Sun 11 a.m.-3 p.m., dinner Sun, Tue-Thu 4-9 p.m., Fri-Sat 4-10 p.m., 42072 5th St., 951-699-2895, [www.gamblingcowboy.com](http://www.gamblingcowboy.com).

### Transportation

Since the airport is about seven miles from downtown Temecula and approximately 10 miles from wine country, vehicle

transportation will be needed. Call The Jet Center to arrange delivery of a Hertz, Enterprise, or Avis **rental car**, 951-696-9344. French Valley Aviation can arrange for an Avis or Enterprise car, 951-677-2756.

**Red Top City Cab** drivers offer extensive knowledge of the Temecula Valley and local attractions with curbside pickup from anywhere, including French Valley Airport, 951-694-3333, [www.redtopcitycab.com](http://www.redtopcitycab.com).

For a sober driver and a carefree getaway with multiple winery visits and tastings, Grapeline offers daily public and private **shuttle wine tours** in comfortable sedans, limos, SUVs, and large shuttles. The vineyard picnic tour features six hours in wine country and a full picnic lunch provided by a local vineyard restaurant, starting at \$99 per

person. If a half-day of tasting is enough, try the cheese and wine tour, offered only on Saturdays. This tour begins at 10 a.m. or 2 p.m., visits three wineries, and offers a light snack of cheese, fruits, and nuts on a beautiful olive cheese board, \$89 per person. 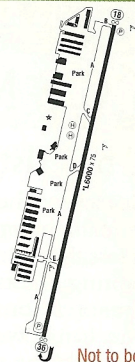
